1. Welcome

The Chair, Jamie Seakens, welcomed everyone to the Annual Parish meeting of Boxted Parish Council for 2023. The purpose of the meeting is to describe what the Council did over the last year and our plans for the next year and to hear the views of residents.

2. Approve the Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 9 March 2022

The minutes were approved.

3. Chairman's report

It is usual for the Chair of Boxted Parish Council to summarise the council activities for the financial year in a report that is available to the Annual Parish Residents Meeting.

Last year we were lucky to attract a new tenant to run a café at the community hub. Doug Harper came in until the planned building refurbishment, took an enforced break and has restarted again. He runs a very successful and popular hub café providing a great addition to the recreation ground and village hall facilities.

The community hub building has undergone a refurbishment seeing improved changing facilities for the sports teams and Boxted runners. We have decent officials' rooms, individual showers, more toilets, a committee room and kitchenette. The café has improved access, large bi-fold windows looking onto the field, new flooring, lighting as well as increased kitchen space for food preparation. The cost of the project was just a bit more than £250,000 which was part funded from S106 money held by Colchester Council for Boxted as an offset for the disruption that the Hill Farm development caused the village, and Football Foundation (part of the FA) support.

The council saw two positions becoming vacant during the year which were filled by Steve Bays and Lee Smith. All council positions are subject to election, which takes place on the 4th May 2023.

The village green continues to develop and look lovely with the much-appreciated support of the volunteer Boxted Wildlife Group. The green has two areas planted with wildflowers. Hedging and

bulbs have been supplemented around the perimeter. We still have to install the memorial bench, designed and made by Julian Carter, around the centre tree.

Boxted Wildlife group now organise monthly walks and are looking to maintain access to public footpaths in the village.

We are lucky to have a volunteer group of litter pickers that will be working with Boxted Wildlife to have a spring clean litter pick in April.

Cllr Lewis Barber continues to support Boxted on County Council matters including Highways (potholes and verges) and facilitating information exchange on the Essex Highways plans to completely replace the beautiful, historic, and important Boxted bridge over the Stour in the Dedham Vale AONB. The Parish Council continues to support the Save Our Bridge campaign to try and persuade Essex Highways to restore rather than replace Boxted bridge.

Colchester Homes were successful in their application to turn their garage site into additional homes. The parish council worked hard to require them to support the current level of parking enjoyed by Boxted Cross residents but with little success. We expect that Dedham Road will be much more congested when their development starts.

We are still working with Essex and Colchester Councils to try and establish Boxted Primary School as a feeder school to Chesterwell, but this has been resisted so far.

The overflow parking on the recreation ground has been used a lot and has hopefully reduced the school drop off/pick up parking congestion.

We are using the council facebook page to make available useful information and regularly writing reports in the Langham with Boxted Parish Newsletter.

The usual parish council functions have run smoothly with good financial management and record keeping. The minutes might seem a bit dry when you read them, but they accurately capture the decisions that the council makes.

Looking forward to the next year we hope to provide better lighting of the village hall car park and install table tennis/pétanque. We are also supporting the King's Coronation Celebrations planned for Sunday 7th May on the recreation ground.

I want to take this opportunity to thank every current and recent member of the council, our clerk, groundsman, and cleaning staff, for their hard work, enthusiasm, and commitment to improving Boxted as a lovely place to live. I also want to thank Nigel and Lewis, our representatives at Colchester City and Essex County Councils. Being a councillor isn't always easy, and we all lead busy lives, but effective committed parish councillors mean that Boxted stands the best chance of being a great place to live, work and play.

Do come along to our meetings, you are very welcome.
